Truckee Meadows Nature Study Area



Truckee Meadows Parks Foundation (TMPF) is working to rehabilitate the area formerly known as Rosewood Lakes Golf Course to a functional wetland system. This will be accomplished through the efforts of 14 AmeriCorps members serving one-year or six-month service terms, TMPF staff, and our partners. The property will reopen as a public space where community members can learn about the environment and spend time in nature.

Who: TMPF, City of Reno, National Parks Service, Community Foundation of Western Nevada, AmeriCorps, the University of Nevada, and the public.

What: Powered by a federal AmeriCorps grant, create a functional wetland system where people can recreate and learn. Staff and volunteers will remove invasive plant species, reseed with natives, build trails and interpretive signage, construct bird blinds, and more.





When: TMPF and the City of Reno are currently in the process of master planning the restoration project. Restoration operations are expected to begin in September, 2019.

Where: The former Rosewood Lakes Golf Course property is a 220-acre parcel located at 6800 Pembroke Dr. in Reno, NV.

Why: Rosewood Lakes is one of the last vestiges of a once vast expanse of wetlands in the Truckee Meadows. This property no longer deliver the ecosystem services that wetlands are known to provide.
